Canadian Dental Care Plan (CDCP)

RECENT UPDATES

Health Canada announced final phase of rollouts for ages 18-64, applications opening in **May** and coverage as early as **June 1, 2025**. As of **May 30, 2025**, any Canadian above the age of **18** is eligible for the Canadian Dental Care Plan.



Current CDCP members must renew enrolment by **June 1st** to avoid lapse in coverage. Coverage ends **June 30th** for those not renewing.


- Fees for service are determined on a provincial basis according to a benefits grid
- Dentists do not need to bill according to this benefits grid, if a dentist charges above the allowed fee for a service, the member will be responsible for the difference
- Even at 100% coverage, a member may be paying out of pocket for standard dental procedures



*Percentage will be based on the eligible amount for covered health care service costs at CDCP-established Fees


Provincial Associations vs CDCP fees

2025 Typical recall* appointment fee comparison




Typical recall* comparison (New Brunswick)

IP plans vs. CDCP coverage




Typical recall* comparison (Nova Scotia)

IP plans vs. CDCP coverage




Typical recall* comparison (PEI)
